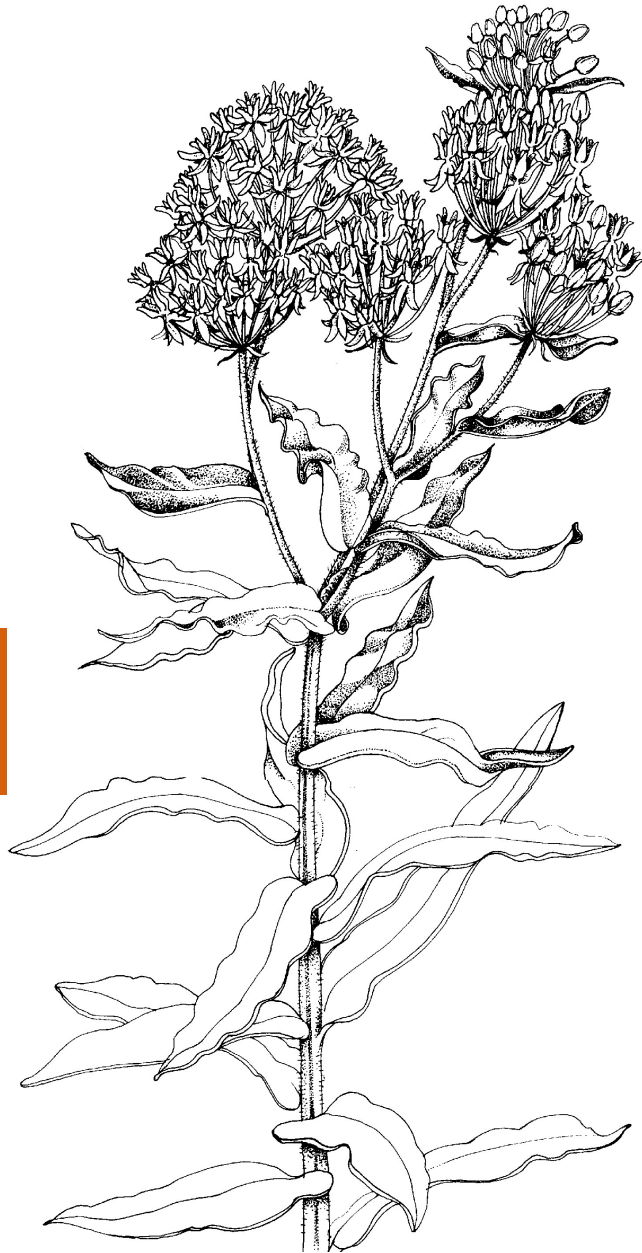

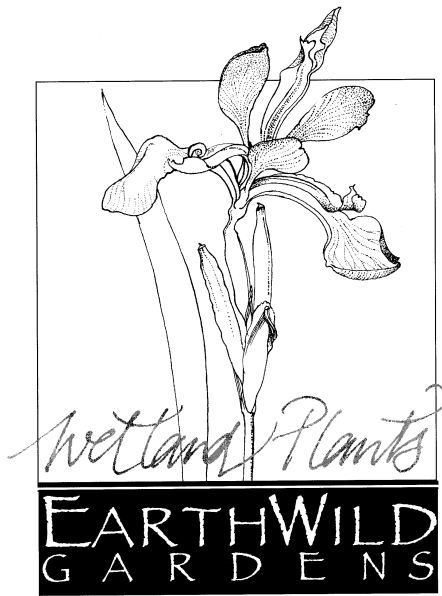

BUTTERFLIES AND BIRDS



Plant these beauties and just watch the butterflies and birds flock to your yard. These plants provide food and shelter for nature's creatures. For full sun and medium soils.

Butterfly Weed, New England Aster, Rough Blazing Star, Pale Purple Coneflower, Showy Golden Rod & Indian Grass

CHILDREN'S GARDEN

The sights and smells of these curiously beautiful native plants will capture the imagination of young and older ones alike! For full/part sun & medium soils.

Anise Hyssop, Rattlesnake Master, Turtlehead, Brown Eyed Susan, Prairie Blazing Star, Cup Plant & Sweet Vanilla Grass



RAIN GARDEN

These plants like their feet seasonally wet. They will thrive in a swale, low spot in your garden, or at the edge of a pond. Create a wildlife habitat that will give you hours of viewing pleasure. Full sun and wet to moist soils.

Blue Flag Iris, Cardinal Flower, Great Blue Lobelia, Obedient Plant, Culver's Root, Common Rush & Common Tussock Sedge



CLAY BUSTER

Do you have soil that is like concrete by mid summer? These plants thrive in the toughest of clay soils thanks to their deep tap roots. Nature at work in the prairie! Besides being extraordinarily well-suited to our Lake County soils they are very pretty. Full sun and medium to dry soils.

Big Bluestem, Purple Coneflower, Rough Blazing Star, Wild Bergamot, Black-Eyed Susan & Compass Plant

WOODLAND CLASSICS

These plants are perfect for the edge of a woodland, near the house, or where there is dappled shade. Spring ephemerals bloom in May-June and are gone by the heat of summer. For shade to part-sun and medium soils.

Wild Columbine, Jack in the Pulpit, Shooting Star, Sweet Joe Pye Weed, Wild Geranium Woodland Phlox & Bottlebrush Grass

SHORT SUN GARDEN

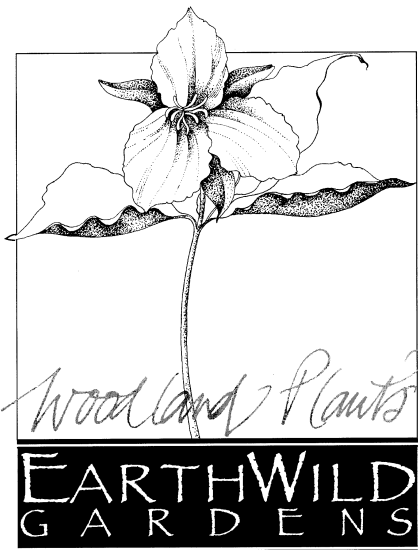
Not all prairie plants need to reach the sky to show their stuff. Some are lower growing (6"-30" high) and less overwhelming for more structured settings. Full to part sun in medium soils.

Prairie Smoke, Wild Petunia, Nodding Wild Onion, Ohio Spiderwort, Lanceleaf Coreopsis & Prairie Drop Seed

NATIVE VINES -



Trumpet Creeper (*Campsis radicans*) Should be called the "hummingbird vine" as they will flock to this vine when its red/orange trumpet flowers bloom. Will tolerate salt. FULL-1/2 SUN.
Quart—\$9.00

Bittersweet (*Celastrus scandens*) An excellent vine, grows quickly. Need 1 male to 2-3 females to bear fruit. Makes nice dried arrangements.
 FULL-1/2 SUN. **5 Gallon—\$23.00**

Virgin's Bower (*Clematis virginiana*) Prolific white flowers bloom in August and September. Seed sets form ornamental puffballs into Dec.
 FULL-1/2 SUN. **Quart—\$9.00**

Kentucky Wisteria (*Wisteria macrostachy*) Flowers are purple-blue. Blooms reliably where non-native varieties won't. May take 2-3 years to bloom but well worth the wait! Plant on a trellis. Needs good garden soil. FULL-1/2 SUN. **5 Gallon—\$23.00**

NATIVE SHRUBS –

Our trees and shrubs make superb additions to any landscape. **Shrubs come in 5 gallon containers and are priced \$30 each.** Contact us or check out our website for wider selection.

Black Chokeberry (*Aronia melanocarpa*)

The birds won't eat them until other food sources get scarce! White blooms in April/May and berries turn dark in August. Vibrant red-orange fall color. 6'h & 4'w. FULL-1/2 SUN.

Carolina Allspice (*Calycanthus floridus*)

In May it has maroon flowers that have a delightful strawberry fragrance which grows stronger in the evening. Flowers and leaves are used in potpourri. JUNE delivery. 6-8'h & 6'w. FULL-1/2 SUN.

Buttonbush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*)

A wetland shrub that does well with garden soil. White flowers form perfect balls and have musky sweet scent. 8-12'h & 8-12'w. FULL SUN.

Red Osier Dogwood (*Cornus stolonifera*)

White flowers in spring, white fruit in summer, great red fall leaf color, but the red stems in winter make this one really stand out! Likes moist soils. 6-8'h & 6-8'w. FULL SUN.

American Filbert (*Corylus americana*)

Produces edible hazelnuts/filberts, but you will have better luck with 2-3 plants together. Likes a half day of sun and good garden soil. Great fall color. 8'-10'h & 8'-10'w. FULL-1/2 SUN.

Dwarf Honeysuckle (*Diervilla lonicera*)

Low mounding shrub, great for massing in drier sites in part shade. Yellow spring flowers are nice, but the real show comes in the fall with yellow, red and orange foliage! 3'h & 3'w. PART SUN-SHADE

Common Witch Hazel (*Hamamelis virginiana*)

Yellow blooms late in Sept.-December. Appreciates moist soils, but tolerates rocky and clay soils. Found usually under trees or on the edge of a forest. 6-12'h & 6-12'w. FULL-PART SUN.

Oak Leaved Hydrangea (*Hydrangea quercifolia*)

Beautiful flowers in June and July. Leaves are oak shaped. Needs some protection from strong winds. 6'h & 4'w. 1/2 SUN-SHADE.

Kalm's St. John's Wort (*Hypericum kalmium*)

Beautiful yellow flowers at the end of June and early July. Great for massing. Does well with clay soils. Has been suggested for herbal remedies. 30" h & 30" w. FULL SUN.

Winterberry (*Ilex verticellata*)

An American holly, while not evergreen, the berries are fantastic! Not separated into male and female, so they should be massed in groups of at least 3-5. Requires a slightly lower pH soil. 8-12'h & 8-12'w. FULL SUN.

Spicebush (*Lindera bezoin*)

A shade tolerant shrub. Small yellow flowers bloom in early April before it leafs out. Leaf and stem have a lemon fragrance. Bright yellow leaves with 1/2" long scarlet fruit in fall. 6-12'h & 6-12'w. SHADE.

Northern Bayberry (*Myrica pensylvanica*)

Used to make bayberry candles. Does well in sideyards. This plant is great in well drained sites. Requires very little pruning and is slow growing. 5'h & 4-6'w. FULL SUN.

Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius*)

Pink to white blooms form umbel-like clusters in June. Exfoliating bark adds interest. Durable shrub that compliments any border. 8-10'h & 8-10'w. FULL-1/2 SUN.

Smooth Sumac (*Rhus glabra*)

A great addition for well drained heavy clay soils! Ideal for berm plantings and screening, as it will sucker. Has consistently brilliant fall color. 10'h & 10'w. FULL SUN.

Wild Black Currant (*Ribes americanum*)

You can't beat edible landscaping! Low growing shrub that does well in shade. Flowers in June and fruit is edible in August. 3'h & 3'w. PART SUN-PART SHADE.

Early Rose (*Rosa blanda*)

Also called the "Smooth Rose," but don't count out the possibility of thorns. Pink blooms in May to June and sporadically thru the season, with red fall color with rose hips. 4'h & 4-6'w. FULL-PART SUN.

Coralberry (*Symphoricarpos orbiculatus*)

Forms low dense thickets, native to oak savannas. Clusters of decorative small purple berries persist through the winter, until eaten by birds just before spring. 3'h & 6'w. FULL-1/2 SUN.

American Cranberry (*Viburnum trilobum*)

White flowers and bright red fruit to attract the birds in winter. Does well with a few hours of sun, not drought tolerant. 8'-10'h & 5'-8'w. FULL-1/2 SUN.

NATIVE TREES

All of the trees are grown in root bags and weigh approximately 50 lbs. **A tree transplanted in a root bag has 60-70% of its roots versus 10-15% for a normal ball and burlap tree.** Unlike other nurseries, they are grown from seed not cloned from cuttings. This results in heartier trees that grow much faster once planted. Root bags must be removed before planting.

The trees are listed by height, caliper (trunk thickness) and/or 5 gallon containers, and are priced accordingly. Check with us to see if other sizes are available. **We can't hold this variety of trees and shrubs in stock so place your orders before April 20, and take advantage of our 20% discount for subtotals of \$90 and over.** Order the bigger trees even earlier so that we can be sure to have them ready for you! Ohio Buckeye (*Aesculus glabra*)

An understory tree, the first to leaf out in spring. Yellow-green flowers in May give way to 1" fruit that resembles the eye of a deer.
20-30'h & 20-30'w. SHADE

Kentucky Coffee (*Gymnocladus dioica*)

Large leaves that require large branches. An ugly duckling that turns into a beautiful swan. Females produce 3"-6" seed pods.
40-60'h & 30-50'w. FULL SUN.

Speckled Alder (*Alnus rugosa*)

A native alder that tends to be multi stemmed. Best used in groups in wet areas and flood plains. Grows rapidly and fixes nitrogen in the soil.

Ironwood (*Ostrya virginiana*)

A superb understory tree with yellow fall color. A great screen, low branched leaves persist through winter. Fruits look like hops, hence aka "Hop Hornbeam."

Paw Paw (*Asimina triloba*)

Native fruit tree, said to be Thomas Jefferson's favorite. Part of tropical family of trees. Purple flowers, yellow fall color. Likes moist soils, protection from the west.

Quaking Aspen (*Populus tremuloides*)

Displays yellow fall color and cream colored bark. Trembling leaves shimmer. CAUTION! Suckers can produce 10 plants in 2 years.

Yellow Birch (*Betula lutea*)

The most shade tolerant of birches. Moderate to fast growing, needs moist soil and only a few hours of sunlight. Twigs smell of wintergreen, exfoliating brown bark.
30-40'h & 30'w. FULL SUN-SHADE.

American Plum (*Prunus Americana*)

Excellent snow-white flowers in spring. Fall color is maroon-red. Edible fruit has sweet flesh and sour skin that makes nice preserves. A fast growing tree that will sucker freely.
15-20'h & 10-15'w. FULL SUN.

Blue Beech (*Carpinus caroliniana*)

One of the best mid-sized trees. Part of the birch family with catkin flowers, yellow/orange fall color and blue fluted bark. Tree is highly adaptable.

Bur Oak (*Quercus macrocarpa*)

Illinois is the Prairie State and Bur Oak is the prairie oak. Very tolerant of heavy clay soil, high pH and open areas. Very adaptable, fast growing oak.

Catalpa (*Catalpa speciosa*)

Puts on a great flower show at the end of May. One of the fastest growing trees in our list. They like full sun and are very adaptable. A Midwestern beauty.

Chinquapin Oak (*Quercus muehlenbergii*)

One of our favorite oaks. Leaves are not lobed, but serrated. Does well as a street tree, tolerant of pH and drought. Fast growing at 2-4 ft per year.

Pagoda Dogwood (*Cornus alternifolia*)

Horizontal branches and beautiful white flowers. Blue-black fruit attracts birds in August. Needs protection from hot sun and moist soils.

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*)

The most shade tolerant of the oaks. Only needs a few hours of sun a day. Outstanding red fall color. Medium to wet.

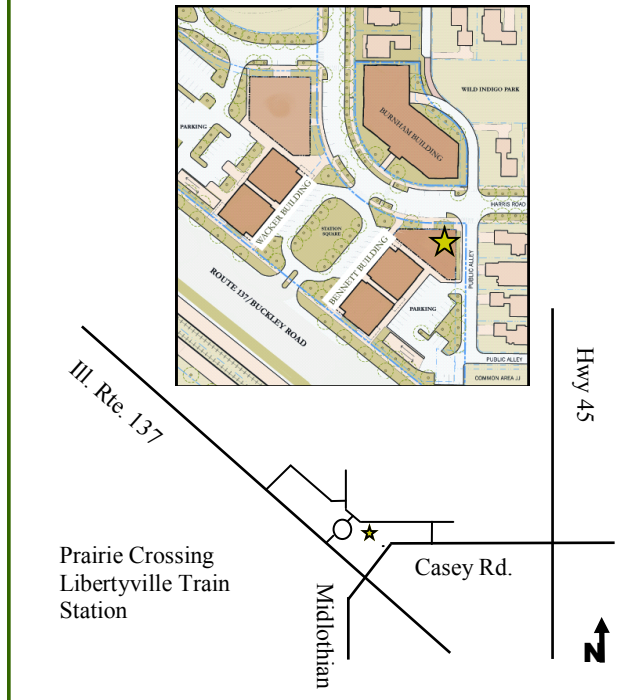
